<b>CLEARING</b>	Obtaining official release from post
<b>CODE OF CONDUCT</b>	Ethical conduct/guidelines which guide a Soldier in combat and if captured
<b>COLORS</b>	National and unit/organization flags
<b>COMMISSARY</b>	Grocery store for military
<b>COMBAT SERVICE STRIPES</b>	Stripes for time served in combat (6 months per stripe)

<b>FAMILY CARE PLAN</b>	Written instructions for care of family members while sponsor is away from duty station (can include provisions for finances, wills, and guardianship)
<b>FAMILY PROGRAM COORDINATOR</b>	Provides family support services to Reserve Component members and families; active duty members and civilian employees
<b>FAMILY READINESS GROUP</b>	Organization of family members, volunteers, and Soldiers/civilian employees belonging to a unit/organization that together provides an avenue of mutual support and assistance and a network of communication among the family members, the chain of command, and community resources.
<b>FIELD DAY</b>	Designated day for military displays
<b>FIELD GRADE FORMATION</b>	Major, Lieutenant Colonels, and Colonels
<b>FROCK</b>	Gathering of Soldiers in a prescribed way
<b>FRUIT SALAD</b>	Assume next higher grade without pay
<b>GARRISON</b>	Post or community
<b>GEAR</b>	Equipment used by Soldiers or civilian employees
<b>GI BILL</b>	Education entitlement
<b>GI PARTY</b>	Clean up duty
